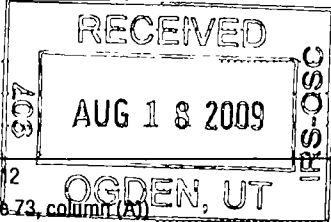

Wilderness Outreach Program

774,345.

Our Wilderness Outreach Program reached tens of thousands of people through our quarterly newsletter, radio, & TV announcements, public presentations, community outreach, conferences, & special events. Each of these contracts with the public stressed the importance of wild public lands & their role in our society, economy, & culture.

Our grassroots organizing work successfully mobilized thousands of volunteers across New Mexico & the entire country to work in various ways to protect the wild places of New Mexico. We have engaged in letter-writing campaigns, membership drives, rallies, meetings, direct hands-on wild land restoration work, & house parties to allow the public the opportunity to make their voices heard & to have a role in promoting our mission.

Our efforts at coalition building continued to bear fruit. We maintained existing coalitions & created new ones for our new issues campaigns. We helped raise funds to protect the Chupadera Peak Wilderness & we created new partnerships with acequia & land grant communities for our work on the El Rio Grande del Norte National Conservation area. Coalitions were led & maintained as part of our work on Sabinoso, Otero Mesa, the Roadless Rule, 1872 Mining Law Reform, & our Dona Ana County Wilderness campaign. We continued to grow our membership & volunteer base throughout 2007 & 2008. We produced & published our 2008 Wild Guide, which brought hundreds of volunteers out on service projects & hikes across the state. Our membership grew to 5,500 individuals & families across the state & country, making us one of the largest conservation non-profits in the state of New Mexico.

Wilderness Protection Program

98,426.

Our Wilderness Protection Program saw the passage of the Sabinoso Wilderness Bill in the House of Representatives & its introduction within the Senate. Additionally, we were able to establish a moratorium on drilling on Otero Mesa until the Salt Basin Aquifer Study could be completed by the Interstate Stream Commission & USGS. We also reached important milestones in our efforts to protect land in Dona Ana County & with the El Rio Grande del Norte National Conservation Area. We continued to engage in dozens of volunteer service projects designed to repair damage to the wild places of New Mexico. Furthermore, our wilderness inventory included more on the ground surveys of land within the Carson & Santa Fe National Forests. We activated hundreds of various constituents for the U.S. Forest Service Travel Management Rule planning in New Mexico's forests, resulting in numerous route closures & massive public awareness for the process & off-road vehicle abuse. Additionally, we were instrumental in the passage of a state bill that would analyze the impacts of off-road vehicles on our national forests & make recommendations to the state on how to curb irresponsible users.
